## **NEW ARIZONA LAW**

For those who have not heard about this little publicized fact: Arizona Senate Bill SB 1027 "active duty pay; tax exemption" was approved by the House by a 48 to 4 vote (plus 8 who were either unavailable to

vote or didn't have the courage to vote), after an original 29 to 1 vote in the Senate. It was passed to the Governor who signed the Bill on 20 May, and now becomes law for tax year 2006. The provisions of this bill will exempt the military pay of active duty Military Personnel, who are legal residents of Arizona, from Arizona State income tax regardless of where they are assigned. Unfortunately, the bill is effective only for tax year 2006.

## **VETERANS LICENSE PLATES**

Did you know that our State has no true count of how many veterans live here in Arizona and here is just one more way of letting our State leadership know we're here for just 25 initial application fee/ \$25 annual renewal.

Applicant must be a veteran and provide a copy of a DD214, 215, 2 (retired), 2 (reserve) or 1173; or provide an original statement of honorable service from the US Department of Veterans Affairs or the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services (ADVS) or any one of the following cards: American Legion, Disabled American Veteran, Military Officers of America, Veterans Administration Medical, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Military Order of the Purple Heart, Vietnam Veterans of America, Active duty or Inactive duty.\$17 of the initial and annual renewal fee goes to the State Home for Veterans Trust Fund.

These plates may also be issued to the spouse, parent, child, brother, or sister of an eligible person who has been issued this plate.

Special Plate Application (form #96-0143) is required. Your plate may be personalized with maximum of 5 characters and is also available with a disability symbol.

Plates are now available for motorcycles and may be personalized with maximum of 4 characters and/or the disability symbol.

## SOUTHERN ARIZONA VETERANS MEMORIAL CEMETERY

When the Federal Government funded and built the Southern Arizona Veterans Memorial Cemetery on land donated by the Army and Fort Huachuca several years ago it was with the agreement that the State of Arizona would have to fund its actual operation and maintenance. This caused concern several years ago when money became tight in Phoenix due to the multi-fuel fiasco.

Recently, a group of service clubs in the Sierra Vista have formed a foundation to ensure that the cemetery is properly maintained and to serve as a tax-exempt source for donations.
